The discussion in this session will reflect on elements that are needed to ensure that our students are ready to embrace the challenges of this century, and the ecosystem required by the school leaders to help them move their schools and communities to a place of inclusivity and respect for every child.

Its competitive edge will be determined by the ability of its citizens to create, share, and use knowledge effectively. Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) is an important element of the nation's education initiative. Vocational subjects, with the virtue of being aligned with the industry, help in linking education with employment through knowledge and skills that can make students employable.  Aligned with Government's vision, FICCI also recognizes the need to improve quality of vocational education from school itself. This session will therefore aim at redefining the need for critical elements of imparting vocational education and training to make it aspirational, flexible, relevant, inclusive and creative. It will intend to understand the challenges pertaining to successful integration of vocational education in schools and describe the need for mainstreaming it in the country.

While this is an important opportunity for EdTech to improve teaching and learning at scale, what is far more complex and critical is to ensure that EdTech can advance equitable, high-quality education for all learners regardless of where they live, how much their family earns, or where they study.</p> <p>This session will focus on access (access to technology), effective use (use of technology or product), and impact (positive &amp; transformative benefits from use of that technology) as the three important principles towards bringing in a scaled impact on learning.</p>
